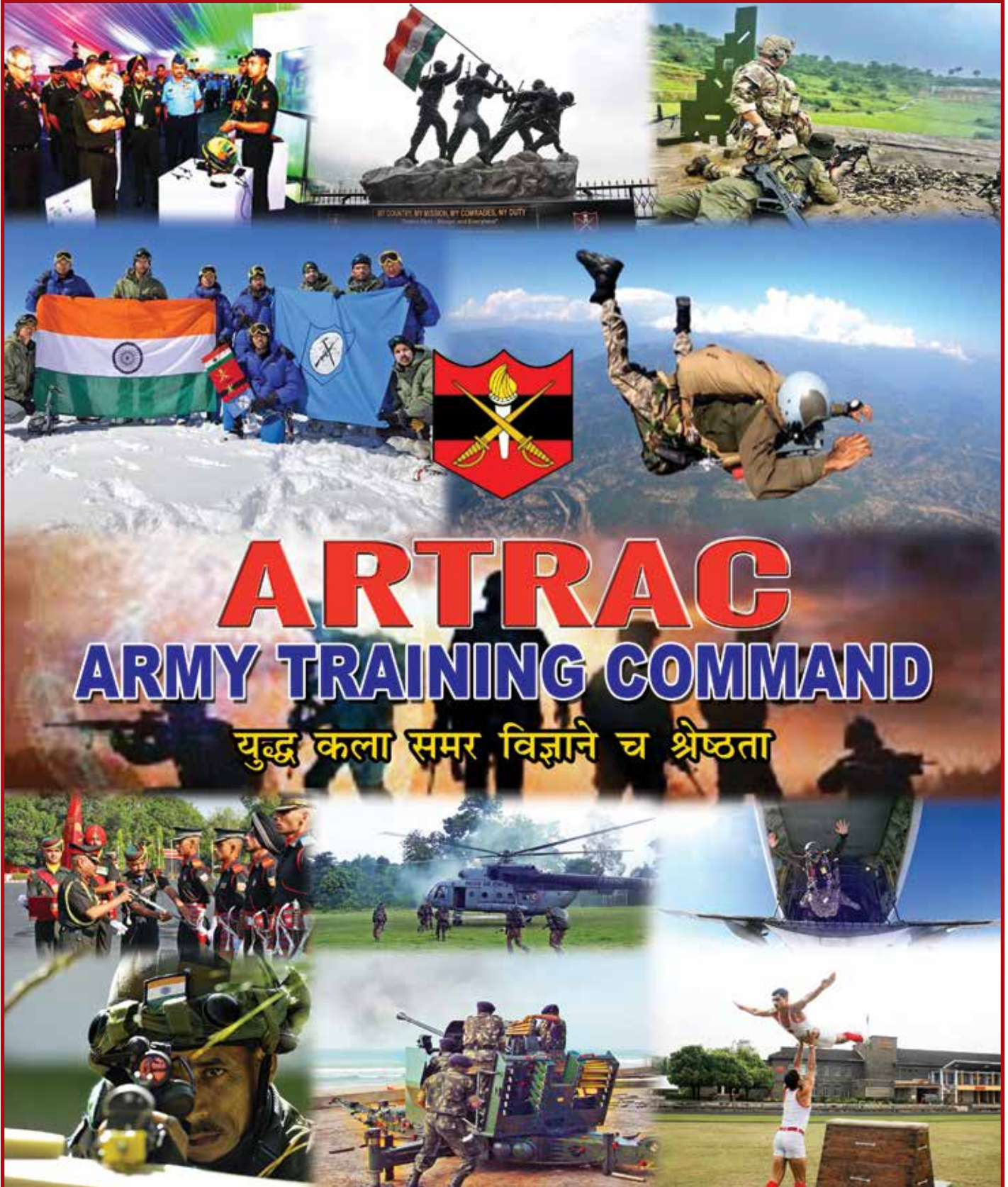

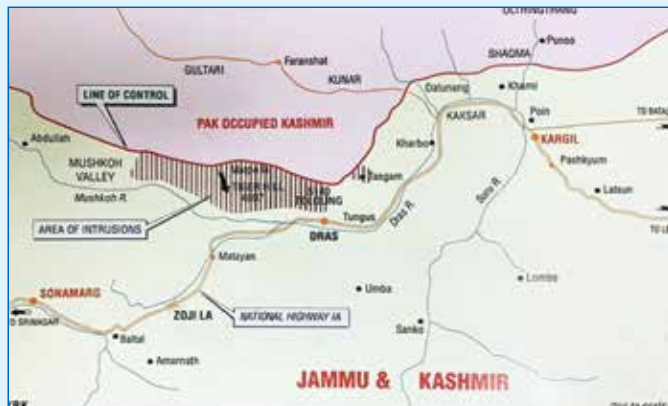

# BATTLE OF TOLING: TURNING POINT OF 1999 KARGIL WAR



PAKISTANI INTRUSION IN DRASS AND MASHKOH

The Battle of Tololing was a pivotal battle in the Kargil War between Indian Army and troops from one full battalion of Pakistan's Northern Light Infantry who were aided by Pakistani irregulars in 1999. The Tololing peak dominates the Srinagar-Leh Highway (NH 1D), which is a vital link and main supply route to Leh. Tololing was also connected to Point (Pt) 5140, another important feature where Pakistani intruders were positioned, taking shots at the traffic on the highway. The Battle of Tololing stands testimony to the valour, commitment and sacrifice of the Indian Army soldiers.

The task of clearing and securing Tololing was initially given to 18 GRENADIERS. The Grenadiers began their operations on 22 May 1999. The inhospitable terrain provided little help to the Indian Army as their advance was halted. Grenadiers kept a strong fight on but they suffered heavy losses in both men and material. While the Indian Army continued to bolster artillery and firepower, deadly cross-fire from the enemy hiding in the rocks made their task more difficult with each passing day. But Tololing's capture was imperative to clear the mountains of the intruders. Armed with the perseverance and resolve that the Indian Army is known for, 18 GRENADIERS were joined by 2 RAJPUTANA RIFLES who were tasked to eliminate the intruders.

On the night of 12 June, the unit initiated a well-prepared frontal attack. For more than four hours before the attack, as many as 120 artillery guns pounded the Tololing ridges incessantly, firing at least 10,000 shells. Charlie Company of 2 RAJPUTANA RIFLES led by Major Vivek Gupta and Delta Company under Major Mohit Saxena set out for assault, while Alpha and Bravo Companies were nominated as

reserves. Charlie Company's objective was Tololing Top and D Company's objective was Point 4590. The assault teams named Abhimanyu, Bheem and Arjun climbed up to their designated positions to launch the attack. The teams surrounded the intruders entirely. A team of Grenadiers, meanwhile, provided covering fire to prevent the enemy from approaching from nearby ridges.

Captain Vijayant Thapar led his platoon into the attack with a ferocity that took Pakistanis by surprise. Another shock to the Pakistanis came in the form of an attack with a reserve platoon led by Major Vivek Gupta from the rear. As the Company attacked from the open, they were directly in the enemy's line of fire. Undeterred, Major Gupta fired a rocket launcher at the enemy's position and charged on before the enemy could recover. He was hit by two bullets but that didn't stop him from engaging in a fierce hand-to-hand combat and killing three enemy soldiers before succumbing to his injuries. Following suit, the other soldiers and teams advanced and the three-week assault finally culminated with India taking control of the peak and changing the course of the war. Once Tololing fell, it took the Indian Army a mere 6 days to evict well-trenched Pakistani troops from four nearby outposts- Point 4590, Rocky Knob, Hump and Point 5140.

Major Rajesh Adhikari (posthumously), Major Vivek Gupta (posthumously), Major Padmapani Acharya (posthumously) and Havildar Digendra Kumar were awarded the Maha Vir Chakra, India's second highest military honour for their daring actions on the Tololing peak. Col Ravindranath and Captain Vijayant Thappar (posthumously) were awarded Vir Chakra.

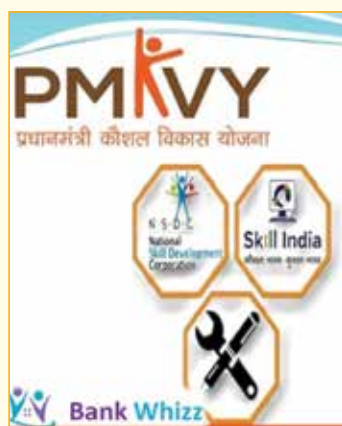

# J & K AND LADAKH DIARY

The Indian Army and the Indian Air Force executed a joint heliborne training exercise in Rajouri showcasing the exceptional preparedness and synergy in execution of special operations.





# NORTH EAST DIARY

GOC-in-C Eastern Command flagged-off the 'Indian Army's Kohima to Kargil (K2K) Motorcycle Expedition' to commemorate the Kargil Vijay Diwas on 02 July. The expedition covered a distance of 3700 km, collecting soil from the hometowns of fallen heroes of the Kargil War.



Indian Army soldiers rescued inhabitants of Mechpara village near Hashimara, where villagers were stranded inside village due to floods. 72 villagers including 24 children were evacuated to safety and were provided with basic first aid.



The Indian Army carried out a joint communication exercise with ITBP and SSB on 15 July. It facilitated seamless communication for operational integration & interoperability in the Kameng sector.



The Indian Army & Govt of Arunachal Pradesh undertook a Joint Fire Fighting Exercise "AGNIRAKSHAK" at Sigar, Arunachal Pradesh on 11 July. The exercise facilitated enhancing synergy in response against natural/ man-made disasters.

# WELFARE AND EMPOWERMENT

To commemorate Kargil Vijay Diwas and celebrate the indomitable spirit of our valiant soldiers, an exhibition was organised by AWWA entrepreneurs and artists on 21 July at Select City Walk, Saket, New Delhi.



The Indian Army assisted civil administration in their efforts towards “Mission Amrit Sarovar” by dedicating a multi-purpose reservoir to the people of Tenga, Arunachal Pradesh. It will facilitate rain water harvesting, conserving water & promoting tourism in the Tenga Valley.



In pursuit towards Digital India initiative, the Indian Army established its 1st Permanent Aadhaar Enrolment Centre at 1 CBPO, New Delhi. The Permanent Centre is connected with 48 Field Post Offices and will cater for Aadhaar related services for all defence personnel & their dependents.



The Indian Army responded swiftly with NDRF and CPWD to plug the breach in the sluice gate of the drain near WHO building and opening of jammed sluice gates of ITO Barrage, New Delhi, to prevent flooding.



Chinar Warriors provided emergency relief & aid to over 650 yatis stranded at NH 44 near Qazigund on 08 July due to inclement weather & landslides at Ramban, leading to temporary closure of NH 44.



On request of civil administration, Flood Relief Column of Indian Army carried out flood relief operations at Patiala, Punjab with effect from 09 to 11 July 2023. First rescue operations were conducted at Chitkara University wherein 910 students and 50 administration staff were evacuated.





# TRAINING

Eight officers from Uzbekistan Army successfully completed the Counter Improvised Explosive Device Course at CME, Pune. Regular exchange courses are being conducted by both the nations as part of Bilateral Defence Cooperation.



GOC-in-C Sapta Shakti Command chaired 'Army-CAPF joint Security Seminar' at Sapta Shakti Command. Key areas of engagement were identified & a roadmap on the way ahead was arrived at during the Seminar.



India-Mongolia joint military exercise "Nomadic Elephant 2023" was conducted at Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia from 17 to 31 July 2023. During the exercise, Indian and Mongolian Army troops engaged in various training activities designed to enhance their skills and capabilities. These activities included endurance training, reflex firing, room intervention, small team tactics and rock craft training. Soldiers from both sides learnt from each other's operational experience and best practices.



Passing out Parade for Medical Officers Basic Course, MOBC-242 comprising 122 Medical & Dental Officers from the Tri-Services including 53 Women Officers was reviewed by Comdt, AMC Centre & College on 17 July. Capt Deepak Singh was awarded Commandant's Rolling Trophy for the 'Best All-round Officer'.
