City cops trace 5k missing children in just 8 months NGOs do their bit to help



Mumbai: Over 5,000 missing minors have been rescued by Mumbai Police till mid-August this year as part of Operation Muskaan, a number that is higher than the past five years' figures combined. Operation Muskaan is a Ministry of Home Affairs project which aims at finding missing children, and rescuing and rehabilitating them.

"Finding missing children is a priority area for us. We have squads at each of our police stations as well as one under the deputy CP (enforcement)," said joint commissioner, law and order, Satyanarainvestigations. A movement initiated by retired ACP Vasant Dhoble maintains an online database of missing persons. If volunteers find a vulnerable person on the street, they click his photo and try to match it with the database

Op Muskaan: Online tools help police rescue missing children

Ten-year-old Mumbai: Ahmed smiles at the mention of 'police chacha'. He has long phone conversations with 'police chacha' -- a 58-year-old sub-inspector from Borivli police station - on how he finds school boring but the sports period is fun.

But things were different until last month. Ahmed would freeze at the mention of the word 'police'. In fact, he had run away from home when his mother found out that he had stolen cash from a neighbour and threatened to call the cops. "I did not sleep a wink for three nights straight until the police team traced Ahmed. He had boarded a long-distance train and reached West Bengal to find his grandparents' home," said Zoya Bi, Ahmed's mother, a single parent.

Ahmed is among over 5,000 minors rescued by Mumbai Police so far this year under 'Operation Muskaan'. A Ministry of Home Affairs pro-

ject, it aims to find missing children, and rescue and rehabilitate them. More children were rescued by Mumbai Police till mid-August this year than those rescued in the past five years combined.

According to Supreme Court directions, the police are required to file an FIR for trafficking or kidnapping once they receive a complaint of a missing minor. An SOP put together in 2016 by the Ministry of Women and Child Development gives details on what information needs to be collected about the missing child, where to look for him/ her, making use of CCTV footage on all transit routes, the local and national agencies that need to be alerted and a national portal where the child's information needs to be uploaded. The SOP also gives details on the procedure to be followed once a missing child is found, which includes producing him/her before the Child Welfare Committee mandatorily, a full medical exam of the child and a home verification before handing

him over to his parents. policewoman recounts an instance when she dressed up as a beggar and squatted outside temples in Karnataka to look for a 15-year-old girl who had run away from her Mumbai home after being turned down by her love interest. The girl has since undergone counselling and is doing better, her family said.

NGOs have chipped in with information that could help investigators. A movement initiated by retired ACP Vasant Dhoble maintains an online database of missing persons with their photos. If volunteers associated with the movement find a vulnerable person on the street, they click his photo and attempt to match it with the one in the database. In case a match is found, the concerned police station is alerted.

Child rights activist Santosh Shinde says that enforcement agencies need to move beyond recording just numbers of rescues and also analyse causes in each case. "The child should be linked with programmes for strengthening his/her family to ensure that he/she does not run away from home a second time. There should be a coordinated effort between all stakeholders to prepare a longterm rehabilitation plan for the child, which should be sustainable," Shinde said.



Air quality warning system network expanded for early alerts in winter

Mumbai: Like for rain, one can now be prepared well in advance if air quality forecast shows a worsening trend. Residents from across Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR) who were severely impacted early this year due to high levels of air pollution can be better prepared this winter. Citizens can now access

Air Quality Early Warning System (AQEWS) on the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM) portal. Data is collected from a wide range of monitoring stations to understand real time and forecast data on pollu- MMR.

tion levels.

A presentation was given by the India Clean Air Summit (ICAS) 2023 organised by the Centre for Study of Science, Technology, and Policy (CSTEP). CSTEP is one of India's leading think tanks, with a mission to enrich policymaking with innovative approaches using science and technology for a sustainable, secure, and inclusive society. A dedicated website (ews.tropmet.res.in/mumbai/index.php) puts together detailed historical information, real time data as well as forecast on the contribu-

tion of PM2.5 and PM10 emis-

sions across 24 locations in

Sharing details about the portal, Dr Sachin Ghude, scientist, IITM, said, "Capturing PM2.5 levels of such unprecedented magnitude is a global rarity, and we faced considerable challenges in collecting such exceptional data from the city. Our AQEWS relies on pinpoint accuracy, starting with precise weather forecasts as a foundation."

Addressing the session at ICAS 2023, Ghude explained the portal will help citizens be prepared and choose their activities during winter when air quality deteriorates. "Using this site, the health impacts of severe air

pollution can be avoided by citizens, especially senior citizens and children or those vulnerable to respiratory ailments," he said.

IITM has integrated satellite data on aerosol optical depth (AOD; measure of the effect of aerosols polluting air) from an extensive network of 420 air quality monitoring stations across India for such early warning systems, which are present in Delhi, Pune, Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, Kolkata and Mumbai. "This innovative system holds immense potential as a decision support tool for effective air quality management," said Dr Ghude.

Hotel fire: 3 stuck in room with locked windows, jammed door

Only 2k food samples tested this yr, FDA requires urgent upgrade


Mumbai: The state Food and Drug Administration (FDA) requires an urgent enhancement of its food testing infrastructure, data shows. In 2022-23, the regulatory body could barely collect 2,039 food samples from the city, and results for almost a quarter of these are still pending.

What's even more alarming than the shortage of public testing infrastructure is the fact that the FDA, the nodal agency responsible for upholding drug and food standards, has not established positions for full-time food analysts in any of their three labs located in Mumbai, Aurangabad, and Nagpur.

In 2016, the department submitted a proposal to create these essential roles, but the government has failed to act on it. Therefore, experts from drug testing labs have been temporarily assigned to function as food analysts in all these laboratories.

A recent incident where customers allegedly found a dead rat in their dinner served in a posh Bandra restaurant has rekindled the debate on public food testing facilities, hygiene and surveillance. Data accessed by TOI shows that of the 2,039 food samples collected in 2022-2023, 65% were of standard quality, but 4% were substandard, 2.2% misbranded and 2% were downright unsafe. The Mumbai lab currently has five analysts, Aurangabad has three and Nagpur has just one dabbling between food and drug labs.

The department mostly collects samples of raw materials, such as oil, cereal, pulses and milk. Among prepared food, it mainly collects samples of sweets, and that too mainly during the festival season starting from September. Shailesh Adhao, joint commissioner of the FDA said that raw materials are mostly what they test for purity and to see if they meet the standards and claims written on the labels.

"We don't collect samples of prepared food as that the time they are tested. However, we do expect the restaurants to regularly check their raw materials besides maintaining hygienic conditions," he said. However, officers admit that while manufacturers are subject to numerous production regulations, there is minimal supervision of eateries. Maharashtra has 1.5 lakh food license holders and a staggering 8.5 lakh registrations of food establishments.

As per the Food Safety and Standards Act of 2006 (FSSAI), eateries or vendors with an annual turnover under Rs 12 lakh can seek registration, whereas those exceeding this threshold require a license. In Mumbai alone, there are nearly 1.3 lakh active license holders and 2.4 lakh registered entities. However, the city has

merely 13 food safety officers (FSOs). Therefore, checks for wouldn't retain properties by hygiene or collection of sam

ples happen infrequently. Former FDA commissioner Mahesh Zagade has pointed out that over the years, the government has fallen short in establishing the necessary infrastructure required to conduct thorough food test-

During his tenure, Zagade had submitted a proposal worth Rs 800 crore to build a comprehensive network of labs at divisional and district level. However, Zagade said while the political leadership showed interest, it was not pursued after his tenure.

A senior FDA official said a new food testing laboratory is coming up in Pune, while another lab has been proposed in Nashik. "A comprehensive file for creation of food analyst positions is being prepared," said the officer.

Bhopal man held for duping city angadia firm of ₹90 lakh

Mumbai: The Anti Extortion Cell of Mumbai police has arrested a 40-year-old from Madhya Pradesh for allegedly cheating an employee of a city angadia delivery firm of Rs 90 lakh. Four of his accomplices are wanted.

The AEC arrested Gaurav Navinkumar Jain, native of Bhopal, for luring the employee by promising a handsome commission on business, and duping him after winning his confidence initially. His accomplices allegedly cheated people in Delhi, Indore, Ah-

medabad and Hoshiarpur. The complainant, Navin Sharma, is an employee of a angadia firm, =A1 Enterprises, from south Mumbai.

The angadia system is a century-old system where traders send cash from one state to another through an angadia — a delivery person. The firm used to courier gold and silver to various clients. In March Jain had offered

to work with Sharma. Jain lured him by offering extra 20% commission. "To win Sharma's confidence, Jain initially gave him good business and payment was made promptly only to win his trust.

The deal was that Jain would deposit cash in the courierfirm would say to whom the money was to be delivered. On April 3, Jain deposited Rs 1 crore in the angadia firm and asked Sharma to send it to a

party in Delhi. "After similar deals, Jain won his confidence." said an officer.

Jain later took advantage of the trust he had gained and told Sharma to deliver Rs 1.60 crore but he deposited Rs 70 lakhs in various instalments. In May, when Sharma asked for him to repay, Jain started evading him and claimed he had made all payments due. In July, he claimed that it was the angadia firm that owed

Sharma said he inquired in the market and learnt that Jain had cheated many in Mumbai and elsewhere. On June 6, Jain allegedly took a gold bar worth Rs 85 lakh from Sharma, saying he owed him money.

₹600cr advance to contractors for **CC** roads withheld

Mumbai: CM Eknath Shinde has ruled out a probe into BMC officials' role in the cement concrete (CC) road contracts row. Following complaints from former BJP corporator Makrand Narwekar, the BMC had fined three of the five companies Rs 16 crore, including nearly Rs 10 crore from the company which had bagged the contract for CC roads in south Mumbai.

'Online Uddhay fell in line after shock'

In a veiled dig at Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray, CM Eknath Shinde on Sund ay said some people used to sit at home and run the state online but they gave them an "[electric] shock" and they fell in line. Speaking at an event in Parbhani, he also hit out at Sena (UBT) Sanjay Raut's morning press conferences. TNN

Narwekar said: "I have asked for a statement of the fine imposed, but the BMC roads department has not replied. I'll now have to approach Lokayukta against the road department officials who have colluded with the contractors.

Demanding that BMC terminate the contract for CC roads in south Mumbai, he said: "Not a single road or stretch has been completed...BMC

must now terminate the contract after issuing notices. Fifty stretches were to be completed before monsoon, but between January and June, only one stretch was ready. At this pace, it will take five years to complete the CC roads." Civic officials said the CC road works, which were halted due to the monsoon, will resume in October.

After taking over as CM in August 2022, Shinde had said that all Mumbai roads should be concreted in two years. The BMC floated tenders, but got poor response. In November 2022, tenders were floated afresh and five companies quoted 6-8% above the BMC estimates. Under fire for the cost escalation, BMC told the winning contractors to reduce their rates by 6-8%, but they refused. BMC gave orders to carry out the work 'on par' to these firms unilaterally, and cut costs by around Rs 400 crore.

According to the tender conditions, the firms were to receive a 10% mobilisation advance, in two instalments of Rs 300 crore each. "The first 50% of the advance was to be released after they set up all field offices and started groundwork. The remaining was to be released after they submitted detailed reports of having effectively spent the initial sum on raw materials like steel and cement," said a civic official. "Since notices were issued and fines imposed, it was not possible to release the Rs 600 crore mobilisation advance."

Uddhav slams Modi over rakhis-by-Muslims view

Mumbai: Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray on Sunday hit out at PM Narendra Modi urging BJP workers to celebrate Raksha Bandhan with Muslim sisters, asking if they would get rakhis tied by Bilkis Bano, who was gangraped during the 2002 Gujarat riots, or the Manipuri women who were stripped and paraded by a mob. Speaking at a public rally in Hingoli, Thackeray slammed the PM over the India-Pakistan World Cup cricket match scheduled to be held in Ahmedabad's Narendra Modi Stadium when Pakistan fuels terrorism against India, and alleged Indian spy Kulbhushan Jadhav languishes in a jail there.

Thackeray slammed deputy CM Devendra Fadnavis over his recent overseas trip, saying that when the state was facing a drought-like situation, he was travelling to Japan and accepting an honorary doctorate. Taking a dig at Ajit Pawar's entry into the Shinde-Fadnavis government, he asked how many more wagons will be added to the double-engine government, and said it was now turning into a goods train. Without naming CM Eknath Shinde, Thackeray said a "bearded man" has applied "BJP's washing powder to get clean".

Many from both categories said that almost all insurance companies refuse health cover. Doctors and NGOs added that a big boost for organ donation can come from the Insurance Regulatory & Development Authority of India (IRDAI) when it formulates clear guidelines.

Shibani Gulati, 44, underwent a kidney transplant in 2010. At the time of the surgery, her corporate policy covered her transplant.

"But for a long time after the surgery, neither did the government-run insurance companies nor the private ones covered me for health. After much legwork, a private company was willing but said claims could not be related to any kidney ailments," she said.

Shibani and her doctor's missives to insurance firms and IRDAI have not worked. It is disappointing, she added.

Other organ recipients too said that IRDAI has been silent. A mail sent by TOI to its officials on August 22 about IR-DAI's plans went unanswered and several private insurance firms refused to comment.







Kota: Two NEET students ended their lives within hours of each other in coaching centre hub Kota on Sunday, one flinging himself to the death from the sixth floor of his institute and the other allegedly hanging himself in his rented house over low scores in tests.

The deaths of Maharashtra's Avishkar Shambaji Kasle (17) and Bihar's Adarsh Raj (18) took the student suicide tally in Kota to six this month and 22 since January this year, against 15 in all of 2022.

The fatalities came a week after the state government set up a committee to address the festering problem and asked it to submit a report in 15 days.

TESTS SUSPENDED FOR A MONTH

Kasle, a Class 12 student and resident of Latur, took the extreme step after finishing a test on the third floor of the institute around 3.15pm. He climbed to the sixth floor and jumped off.

Circle officer Dharmveer Singh said no suicide note was found. Kasle had been preparing for NEET in Kota for three years and his scores had dropped in the last routine test, the officer said.

Late on Sunday, the Kota administration reportedly issued an advisory saying there will be no tests for a month at coaching institutes in the city.

Barely four hours later, Adarsh was found hanging from a ceiling fan in his rented house. The Rohtas native was living with his sister and cousin brother, who were also preparing for competitive exams, police said, adding that no suicide note was found.

Adarsh, too, had been scoring low in routine tests at his coaching institute and was upset over it, said ASP (Kota city) Bhagwat Singh Hingad.

In a 1st, Vikram sends temp profile of lunar south pole

Records 60°C At Surface To -10°C Underground

Bengaluru: In the first data officially announced from the south pole of the Moon since Chandrayaan-3's lander Vikram made a flawless landing there, Isro said on Sunday the lander's payload has recorded the temperature profile of the lunar topsoil, or how temperature varies at the lunar surface and deeper inside. This is the first such profile for the lunar south pole.

The lander's Chandra's Surface Thermophysical Experiment (ChaSTE) payload has a temperature probe equ-



The wide difference between surface and underground temperatures indicate that the Moon's rocks may be good insulation for habitats there

ipped with a controlled penetration mechanism capable of reaching a depth of 10cm beneath the surface. The probe is fitted with 10 individual temperature sensors.

Sharing a graph with the update, Isro said: "The presented graph illustrates the temperature variations of the lunar surface/near-surface at various depths, as recor-

ded during the probe's penetration. This is the first such profile for the lunar south pole. Detailed observations are under way."

The space agency did not immediately elaborate more on this and one scientist told TOI that the data were still being analysed. Looking at the graph it shared, the variation in temperature is in the range of -10°Celsius to 60°Celsius, depending on the depth.

Rover Pragyan was deployed after Vikram's successful landing four days ago. All five Isro payloads on the lander and rover have begun in-situ experiments, and their performance has been normal.

Data from the payload on the propulsion module has also begun reaching the ground stations and Isro is expected to continue making announcements about it.

"Along with our scientists, other sectors have also played an important role in the success of Chandrayaan-3. Many countrymen have contributed in ensuring all the parts and meeting technical requirements,' he added.

In his address at the B20 summit on Sunday, Modi said the "festive season in India started on August 23 this time when Chandrayaan-3 reached the Moon". "Importantly, this time, not only India but the whole world is celebrating it (India's landing on Moon). This celebration is about running a responsible space programme. This celebration is to accelerate the development of the country. This celebration is of innovation. Made mistake, but not ashamed, says teacher in slap row

Agra: Tripta Tyagi, the school teacher, who was seen in a recent video allegedly asking students to slap their Muslim classmate, acknowledged on Sunday that she made a mistake, but added that she is "not ashamed of it."

"I have served in school and society for a long time and so everyone in the area, including Muslims, are with me. We do not see children from a Hindu-Muslim perspective at school... All students are treated the same," she alleged.

Teacher who beat up student over 'Ram' slogan held, principal on run One of the teachers accused of allegedly beating a Class X student for writing "Jai Shri

Ram" on the blackboard at a government school in Jammu's Kathua has been arrested while the principal, a co-accused in the assault, is absconding, police said. Both teacher and principal have been suspended. A hunt is on for Hafiz, police said, adding the case was filed on a complaint by the minor student's father. The teen had to be hospitalised after the thrashing. TNN

Justifying her act, Tyagi, who has been booked by police for her act, added: "The boy couldn't recall multiplication tables that day and his parents told me earlier to be strict with him... To discipline children, teachers scold and also slap them if necessary. There may be laws against it, but sometimes, students have to be taught the hard way."

Meanwhile, the basic shiksha adhikari (BSA) of Muzaffarnagar, Shubham Shukla, said that a team has been sent to Khubbapur village, where the school, Neha Public School, is situated, to conduct a probe in the matter. "Preliminary probe suggests a number of irregularities in the school," the official said.

Threat posters come up near slum, cops deployed

Gurgaon: Posters put up near a slum have threatened members of one community to vacate their houses by Monday-the day rightwing outfits have planned the Brij Mandal Jalabhishek Yatra to Nuh, reports Ishita Singh.

Police said at least two such posters, which include death and rape threats as well, were spotted on Sunday morning, close to the slum. Handwritten in red, the posters were removed by police, who said they had scaled up security in the area and initiated an investigation. In the city, mobs attacked houses, slum dwellers- most of whom are migrant workers from one community-and targeted mosques.

On Sunday, SHO said they suspected the posters were the handiwork of "malicious groups pursuing a political agenda". We are yet to verify whether any VHP members were responsible for this,"he added. However, the VHP members denied any links with the posters.

Youths ask 3 Muslim men for names, attack them

Gurgaon: Three Muslim men were allegedly attacked in Gurgaon by different groups of youths who asked their names and objected to the clothes they were wearing, reports Ankita Anand. The attacks coincide with the call for a Brij Mandal Jalabhishek Yatra in Nuh on Monday. Nasir Hussain, a truck driver, and his helper Ashfaq were assaulted by two individuals in a car, who criticized their appearance and clothing before physically assaulting them.

Another incident occurred on August 20 when Mohammad Monis was attacked near a liquor store. Monis was kicked, punched, and struck with a beer bottle. Police said that after Monis cried for help, his colleagues at his workshop intervened, causing the attackers to flee. Monis was taken to hospital in Delhi. His family arrived from Meerut and took him home. Police are investigating both cases, with one involving intoxicated attackers.



No basmati rice export below \$1,200/tonne

New Delhi: The government on Sunday announced that export of basmati rice below \$1,200 (Rs 99,000) per tonne would not be allowed to restrict possible "illegal" shipment of white non-basmati rice in the garb of premium basmati rice. It said existing contracts below this price have been kept in abeyance.

A committee headed by the chairman of Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority will be set up to evaluate the future course of action. The government said due to low price, there was high demand of Indian rice in the international market. To check domestic prices and to ensure domestic food security, export of non-basmati white rice was prohibited on July 20. TNN



New Delhi: Artificial Intelligence will change the way news is produced and consumed even as its essence will endure, said Vineet Jain, Managing Director, The Times Group. Stressing that it was important to let "innovation be our ally, and truth our guiding star", he said news media would adapt, but its purpose would remain unaltered: "To inform, inspire, and empower."

Delivering a special address at exchange4media's NEWS-

said that as newer realms of broadcasting, digital tech and AI opened up, the challenge would be to uphold ethical standards, put out accurate information to maintain credibility and ensure that algorithms remain unbiased and content stays trustworthy.

He added that he firmly believed that journalists are the best self-regulators and have been at the forefront of safeguarding India's hard-fought media freedoms against external threats.

Tracing the emergence of news from print to TV to digital to AI, he said AI is not about replacing tradition, but about amplifying it. "Imagine a world where news is tailored precisely to your interests, where data transforms into insightful stories. AI fact-checks at lightning speed, guarding truth. Language barriers crumble, allowing news to seamlessly transcend linguistic diversity, an essential transformation for a country like India with its multitude of languages and cultures," he said.

AI cannot replace human element in adjudication: HC

New Delhi: Delhi high court held that artificial intelligence (AI) cannot substitute human intelligence or human element in the adjudicatory process. It said ChatGPT cannot be the basis for judging legal or fac-

The HC underlined that the accuracy and reliability of AI-generated data is still in the grey area, and such a tool, at best, can be utilised preliminary under-

fictional case laws, imaginative data, etc, generated by AI chatbots," the HC noted in a recent order.

The observation came while dealing with a lawsuit by a luxury brand against a partnership firm involved in the manufacture and sale of shoes allegedly in violation of its trademark.

The counsel of the plaintiff said that a shoe name was its registered trademark in India, and placed before the court responses by ChatGPT with respect to its "reputation".

However, the HC noted that the accuracy and reliability of AI-generated data is still in the grey area.

New Delhi: As Russia comes under renewed pressure to revive the Black Sea grain deal with Ukraine, the US and EU are also talking to India to see if it can use its influence with Moscow to ensure resumption of Ukrainian grain exports.

While the deal was brokered by the UN and Turkiye last year to attenuate the effects of the war on global food security, India also had played a role in reaching the agreement, as foreign minister S Jaishankar said earlier this year. While EU foreign policy chief Josep Borrell was reported to have approached G20 foreign ministers earlier this month for help in getting Moscow to rejoin the deal, the US engaged with India at the UN on the issue as it calls upon Moscow to not "weaponise" hunger.

"I know that parts of the American government are engaging with India at the UN level. This is very impor-


3 US Marines die in aircraft crash in Aus during drill


Sydney: Three US Marines died during military exercises in northern Australia on Sunday, the US military said, in an aircraft crash that PM Anthony Albanese called "tragic".

Five others were "transported to Royal Darwin Hospital in serious condition", Marine Rotation Force - Darwin said. It said they were among 23 Marines on the tilt-rotor MV-22B Osprey aircraft during routine training exercises and that the cause of the crash was being investigated. 

Protests in Pak against high electricity bills, **PM holds meet**

Islamabad: Amid a public outcry over inflated electricity bills, Pakistan's interim PM Anwaar ul Haq Kakar held an emergency meeting on Sunday in which he directed authorities to devise "concrete steps" within the next 48 hours for a reduction in electricity bills.

Protests were held in several cities, including Multan, Lahore and Karachi, against the inflated electricity bills on

Saturday, some even threatening a civil disobedience campaign if the extra taxes weren't deducted

Last month, the power regulator raised the national average tariff by around Rs 5 per unit, pushing the base unit power tariff from Rs24.8 to Rs29.8. On August 22, the government once again sought to raise the power rate by Rs3.5 per unit. Pakistan has recently jacked up the power charges as per commitment with the IMF.

"We will not take any step in haste that will harm the country. We will take measures that won't further burden the national exchequer and will facilitate the consumers," Kakar said at the meeting. "It is not possible that while the people face difficulties, officials and the PM continue to consume free electricity paid for with the taxes people pay," he added. He even directed relevant departments and ministries to submit to him the details of the officers who were being provided free electricity. AGENCIES

3 dead in racially motivated shooting at a Florida store

Washington: A masked white man carrying at least one weapon bearing a swastika fatally shot three Black people inside a Florida store Saturday in an attack with a clear motive of racial hatred, officials said. The shooting in a Dollar General store in a predominately Black neighbourhood left two men and one woman dead and "racially motivated", Jacksonville sheriff T K Waters said. In addition to carrying a firearm with a painted symbol of the genocidal Nazi regime of Germany of the 1930s and 1940s, the shooter issued racist statements before the shooting. He killed himself at the scene. "He hated

Taliban ban women from national park over hijab

Islamabad: The Taliban will use security forces to stop women from visiting one of Afghanistan's most popular national parks, according to information shared by a spokesman for the vice and virtue ministry.

The ministry alleges that women have not been observing the proper way to wear the hijab, or Islamic headscarf, when going to Band-e-Amir in the central Bamiyan province. This comes a week after the minister, Mohammad Khalid Hanafi, visited the province and told officials and religious clerics that women haven't been adhering to the correct way of wearing the hijab, asking security personnel to stop women from visiting the tourist hotspot. "Going sightseeing is not a must for women," Hanafi said.

The force said Saturday that there had been "unauthorised access to the IT system" of one of its suppliers. It said the company, which it did not name, had access to names, ranks, photos, vetting levels and payroll numbers for officers and staff, but did not hold personal information. The force said it was "working with the company to understand if there has been any security breach relating to metropolitan police data," and had referred the incident to the National Crime Agency. The metropolitan police federationsaid the breach had caused "anger." "This is a staggering security breach that should never have happened," said federation vice chair Rick Prior. AP

N Korea eases Covid curbs, lets citizens abroad return

Seoul: North Korea said Sunday it will allow its citizens staying abroad to return home in line with easing pandemic situations worldwide, as the country slowly eases its draconian coronavirus restrictions.

In a brief statement carried by state media, the state emergency ppidemic prevention headquarters said those returning to North Korea will be put in quarantine for a week for "proper medical observation." The statement didn't elaborate. But analysts predicted the announcement would lead to the return of North Korean students, workers and others who have had to stay abroad, mostly in China and Russia, because of the pandemic. The workers are a key source of foreign income for the country. North Korea banned tourists, jetted out di-

"I will be calling for a debate after Parliament returns in September, followed by a full statutory inquiry into how this was allowed to happen, and why the recommendation of the MRC (Medical Research Council) report to identify the women was never followed up so thatlessons are learnt," she said.

Hundreds join largest Loch Ness monster hunt in 50 yrs in Scotland

teers joined a two-day

hunt for Scotland's fabled Loch Ness monster on Saturday and Sunday, in what organisers described as the biggest search for the elusive "Nessie" in more than 50 years. The Loch Ness Centre, which partnered with voluntary research team Loch Ness Exploration to organise "The Quest", said they would be using surveying equipment that had not previously been tried at the loch, including thermal drones. Volunteers from around the world were allocated locations around the 23-mile (37-km) long lake from which to monitor for any signs of Nessie, while others took to boats. A hydrophone was also used to detect acoustic signals under the water. The first written record of a monster

relates to the Irish monk St

Columba, who is said to have banished a "water beast" to the depths of the River Ness in the 6th century. The most famous picture of Nessie, from 1934, showed a head on a long neck emerging from the water, but 60 years later it was revealed to have been a hoax that used a sea monster model attached to a toy submarine.



Careful planning necessary to maximise positive impact of dual board exams

hile launching the New Curriculum Framework for school education in sync with National Education Policy 2020 (NEP), the Union Education Ministry noted that board examinations in the country would be conducted twice a year. He further said that the students will be allowed to retain the best score out of the two exam scores.

The academics ponder over the merits and drawbacks of dual board exams in the country. While it could offer more chances for improvement and enhance academic competitiveness, it might also lead to increased stress levels and a casual approach towards studies, they claim.

Students will have an option to enhance their scores

"The consequences of introducing two board exams in a year would heavily depend on the logistics and implementation strategy. If schools are required to complete the syllabus within the current time frame, it might lead to increased pressure on both students and teachers. On the positive side, it would offer students a chance to enhance their scores if they previously could not perform well due to health or family issues," says Nalini Shetty, principal, RBK School, Mira Road, Thane (ICSE Board). "Introducing two board exams could potentially provide students with more opportunities for college admissions. Similar to universities abroad, colleges might need to open admissions twice a year, accommodating students from both exam sessions. This could be beneficial for those who may have not performed well in the first attempt," she adds.

"Holding board exams twice can also result in negative impacts like students may become more casual towards the exams, assuming that they have a second chance to improve. This approach might undermine the seriousness towards studies and dilu-

te their performance," she says. "With two exams, students might experience reduced pressure in terms of content volume to be covered at once. This could lead to better retention of knowledge and a deeper understanding of subjects. Having more frequent assessments can provide a better representation of a student's academic performance, as it reduces the stakes associated with a single highstakes exam. Frequent exams allow for more timely feedback to students, ce," Shetty adds.



helping them understand their strengths and weaknesses in a timely manner, and enabling them to make necessary improvements," says Dhriti Malhotra, director principal, MRIS Sector 46 Gurugram.

Conducting and grading exams is time-consuming

"The other consequences of this can be that instead of reducing stress, having two examinations could potentially increase stress due to the need to prepare for exams more frequently. If the focus shifts towards exam preparation and cramming, the overall quality of education might suffer as teachers and students prioritise examspecific content over holistic learning. Conducting exams is time-consuming for educators. Maintaining uniform standards across two exams in a year could be challenging. The difficulty level and content

covered in each exam would need to be carefully calibrated. Careful planning and consideration would be necessary to maximise the positive impacts and mitigate the negative consequences," adds Malhotra.

Impact on future job prospects

"Introduction of two board exams a year might make the academiclandscape more competitive. Students will be required to consistently perform well to secure admissions and maintain a strong academic record. This could eventually lead to a workforce that is better prepared academically. In the long run, this might contribute to a job market that values consistent academic performan-





Farm export bans limit rural incomes. GOI should offer export parity prices

OI on Sunday tightened restrictions on basmati exports. A minimum price for exports has been fixed at \$1,200 per metric tonne. A contract below the floor price will be evaluated by a GOI committee for clearance. This move needs to be read in the context of two preceding moves to discourage rice exports. In July, exports of non-basmati white rice were prohibited. Subsequently, on August 25, GOI imposed a 20% export duty on parboiled rice. GOI's explanation for Sunday's decision is that it's meant to prevent exporters circumventing rice export bans by misclassifying the product as basmati.

International rice prices are surging—FAO rice price index in July 2023 reached its highest level since September 2011. India has been the world's biggest rice exporter for over a decade and the commodity makes up 18.5% of the country's agri-export basket. In volume terms, non-basmati varieties dominate India's rice exports. In addition to



measures to discourage rice exports, GOI this month also imposed a 40% export duty on onions. The combined impact of these measures is that Indian farmers face an income cap at a time when the global demand-supply scenario is in their favour. Indian consumers, on the other hand, will benefit.

GOI's attempt to put a lid on domestic food inflation makes sense.

Controlling inflation is essential to ensuring India's macroeconomic stability. However, it doesn't have to come at the expense of farmers. The current approach makes it a zero-sum game, helping consumers at the expense of farmers. A way out is for GOI to mop up agricultural products singled out for export restriction or bans at an export parity price, which represents a price farmers would have got if they had been allowed to fulfil their export contracts. This stock can be offloaded in the market to keep prices under check.

It will impose a fiscal cost but any temporary measure can be offset through savings elsewhere, something that happens every year. There are long-term benefits to using export parity prices. Capping farm income in a good year has a negative impact on their willingness to support agricultural reforms. Reforms are characterised by upfront costs and benefits follow once the results show up. However, if farmers are apprehensive about policy instability, convincing them about reforms will be hard even if they are aware that the status quo is unsustainable.

Teach The Teacher

Religion baiting in schools must be responded to by swift and strict penal action. Delays send wrong messages

Schools nowhere are places where only angels tread. Teacher misconduct is also not uncommon. But, still, schools as sites of religion baiting are shocking, especially when backed by those in authority. What happened in a school in UP's Muzaffarnagar, even in a state no stranger to communal politics of the worst kind, can only be responded to by strict and swift penal action. The police has registered a case under IPC section, the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights has issued notices under the Right to Education Act and the Juvenile Justice Act and a state government inquiry has commenced. But the teacher is still making statements and not in custody. Do you need any more prima facie evidence to



take preliminary police action? Note that a principal in a J&K school, where a boy was beaten for apparently writing Jai Shri Ram on the board – a clear case of misconduct by authorities – has been arrested.

In research going back more than a decade (Hanna and Linden 2009), discrimination towards minority students was noted among teachers in a medium-sized

Indian city. The conclusion was drawn on the basis of scoring an exam with substituted student identities. The investigation also found that much of the discrimination came from minority teachers themselves, which suggested that minority teachers may be internalising particular beliefs about their communities.

These are not abstract academic concerns. Discrimination in schools is and can be a lived reality—and what it does to young minds and how that shapes the adult behaviour of those children when they grow up, should be a matter of deep concern for educators and policymakers. Caste prejudice plays out even in elite institutions like IITs. Making an example out of teacher-offenders like the one in Muzaffarnagar is a good start to tackling this toxicity.

Recently at Stratford, I saw *The Empress*, lauded as a brutal expose of the exploited world of ayahs and laskars, but as much of it was straight out of *Victoria and Abdul*. When I indignantly mentioned this to Shrabani Basu, she despaired

over how her original had become a free-for-all. 'Everyone says the story is in

the public domain, but I know how I found it first.'

Four For The Future

The Shadow Army Of China's Communist Rulers

Beijing's United Front Work Department influence activities pose a serious threat to democracies, including India. New Delhi must keep its guard up as crucial elections approach

Although Modi and Xi recently met on the sidelines of the Brics summit – where the two sides reportedly agreed on expeditious disengagement from the LAC standoff – it is important to remember China has employed asser-

tive and coercive strategies in its interactions with nations that do not align with its interests. However, a particularly influential approach has been its utilisation of united front strategy to exert influence globally. The prominence of united front work has witnessed a remarkable surge under Xi's rule. In his 2017 address at the 19th Party Congress, Xi referred to the united front work as a "magic weapon" that is crucial for realising the "great rejuvenation of the Chinese nation". He emphasised that "forming a broad patriotic United Front is vital for the success of the mission of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP)."

China's 'magic weapon'

Naturally, significant resources are allocated to support the United Front Work Department (UFWD), both domestically and internationally. Overseas efforts involve influencing ethnic Chinese communities, leveraging the Chinese diaspora, and luring scholars, journalists and politicians alike in host countries to achieve objectives such as presenting a positive image of China and potentially impacting election results in democratic nations. Important examples include Canada's claims of Chinese interference in its federal elections in 2019 and 2022, and former Australian PM Malcolm Turnbull's assertions regarding CCP's concerted efforts to sway public affairs in Australia.

Additionally, a frequently observed instrument of UFWD is the deployment of Chinese students studying in international universities. These students are tasked with monitoring and reporting the activities of fellow Chinese students to the Chinese embassies, as well as staging protests against figures like the

Dalai Lama during their campus visits.

Additional challenge for New Delhi

While India has remained relatively shielded from certain elements often linked with China's united front strategy, such as Confucius Institutes, the Chinese embassy in India has emerged as a key player in UFWD's activities within the country. This is predominantly achieved through the strategic utilisation of social media platforms to mold and influence public sentiments on critical matters such as Taiwan, the One China Policy, and to cultivate a favou-



rable image of China among the people of India.

The central thrust of UFWD's activities in India centres on funding some think tanks and non-governmental organisations, and influencing journalists and key figures within the strategic community. Notably, there have been instances where individuals posing as scholars affiliated with reputable Singaporean think tanks approached Indian scholars and journalists, aiming to solicit articles about China.

Furthermore, certain Chinese journalists stationed in India collaborated closely with UFWD. India's recent non-renewal of visas of Chinese journalists further underscores this concern. On multiple occasions, some Chinese journalists based in India conducted visits to restricted Tibetan settlements

without revealing their true affiliations and identities.

Carrot and stick approach


China's influence operations extend beyond scholars and journalists; they now encompass the active engagement of some Indian influencers and video bloggers, exemplified by invitations to visit China. This reflects a calculated effort to alter the prevailing narrative and portray a positive picture of India-China relations, fostering the perception that China is a welcoming and attractive tourist destination for Indians. However, it is crucial to acknowledge the contrasting reality. China's actions, such as issuing stapled visas to the residents of Arunachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir, coupled with the disregard for India's concerns regarding border issues, paint a different and less amicable picture. Such discrepancies reveal a divergence between UFWD's tactics in India and China's failure to address India's legitimate concerns.

India has proactively countered China's influence operations to shape the narrative through a series of strategic measures. Noteworthy among these steps are the bans imposed on controversial Chinese apps like Tik-Tok, the halting of Huawei's 5G trials in India, enhanced scrutiny of incoming Chinese investments, and the implementation of stringent visa regulations for Chinese journalists and scholars by India's ministry of external affairs. Amidst the growing tensions between India and China and the increased apprehensions surrounding UFWD, India has also sought appointment of Mandarin teachers from Taiwan instead of China.

In the aftermath of the 2020 Galwan clashes, China's ability to influence public opinion in India has significantly waned. This shift is effectively underscored by the recent Pew Survey findings, where 67% of Indian respondents expressed an unfavourable perception of China. The upcoming Indian elections call for a close monitoring of China's influence operations as well as blocking attempts at influencing public policy.



New Delhi: Foreign direct investment (FDI) equity inflows dropped 34% to \$10.9 billion during the June quarter from the year-ago period, government data showed. Amid an aggressive investment pitch by India, government officials said companies are holding back on fresh funding due to the slowdown in Europe and the US, which has been aggravated by geopolitical tensions.

Other countries have also been hit, with China reporting a 2.7% decline although some, such as Indonesia, have bucked the trend so far in 2023. For the last few months, FDI inflows to India have remained depressed, with 2022-23 being the first time in nearly a decade when overseas direct investments into the country declined.

DPIIT data showed that Maharashtra remained the top destination with equity inflows of \$4.5 billion in the June quarter, as against \$5.2 billon during the same period last year, marking a decline of 13.5%.

Karnataka saw a 46% fall to just under \$1.5 billion during this period. Gujarat saw a 77% slump from \$3.2 billion to \$730 million. Despite a 1.9% decline to \$1.9 billion, Delhi emerged as the second largest destination for FDI equity flows.

Separately, RBI data released earlier this month estimated a 28% fall in gross FDI inflows to \$17.6 billion in the first quarter of the fiscal as companies held back investments amid the global slowdown. Multinational companies also stepped up repatriation of equity, which added up to \$10.4 billion in the June quarter.

New Delhi: Mining magnate Anil Agarwal's Vedanta has won an arbitration against a de-

New Delhi: Eyeing a larger share of business from global and electrics, TVS Motors will invest Rs 3,900 crore over the next four to five years to boost its green portfolio, just as the company develops an all-new petrol and electric platforms with BMW's Motorrad for the Indian and international markets, MD Sudarshan Venu has said.

Sudarshan, who took over the reins of the business from father (and chairman emeritus) Venu Srinavasan, wants TVS to have a bigger share of premium in its sales, while eyeing a bigger pie of business from electrics - including through e-bikes in Europe. The company counts the broadening of its relationship with BMW as one of the key pillars in its future vision, while aggressively pursuing new product launches individually and also through its acquisitions.

"We have envisaged a 'Vision 2030' that will see the company work on sustainable and safe mobility solutions, with a focus on global markets and electrics. TVS

wants scalable technology platforms and solutions as we move ahead from here." Sudarshan told TOI as the company launched a premium electric scooter, called TVS X, priced at an ambitious Rs 2.5 lakh. The new product is placed over TVS' iQube electric, which currently is the second-largest selling green scooter model with monthly sales of around 10,000 units in the recent past.

Of the new investment, Rs 900 crore will be invested this fiscal, while the rest will come progressively over the next three to four years as the com-

pany re-orients itself from a pure-play two-and-three-wheeler entity to one that is focused on connected, sustainable and greens. TVS has "no plans at all" for cars, Sudarshan added when asked if four wheelers are on the agenda.

The company has completed a decade of partnership with BMW to manufacture sub-500cc motorcycles for the globe. The collaboration resulted in products (manufactured at TVS' Hosur factory) derived out of a 310cc platform, which include BMW G 310 R, BMW 310 GS, and TVS Apache RR 310.

"It's been a very special relationship with BMW. You've already seen great products coming out of this, and you will see more products... We are looking at two new platforms - at least one for electric and one for ICE (internal combustion engine)," he said

On Norton Motorcycles, Sudarshan said plans are to develop it as a "global brand" with new products that may be electric. TVS also looks at a strong play in e-bikes in Europe through the acquisition (75% stake) in Swiss E-Mobility Group (SEMG).

45k hit, Assam flood situation stays alarming

Guwahati: The Assam flood situation remains alarming with over 45,000 people, mostly in upper and northern parts of the state, facing the deluge on Sunday due to incessant rain, reports Kangkan Kalita. Mawsynram and Cherrapunji—the two wettest places on earth— saw one of the rainiest days of the season in the past 24 hours with 38 and 29 cm rainfall, respectively, said the Assam State Disas-

ter Management Authority. Sources said the actual number of flood-hit people may surge past 50,000 in Assam as the number of affected districts and sub-divisions has gone up from six to 11 in the past 24 hours. There is no respite for at least four days, with the IMD issuing forecasts of heavy to very heavy rainfall in several parts of the northeast. Around 20,000 people are reeling under the floods in Dhemaji district of Assam, bordering Arunachal.



New Delhi: Amid variability of monsoon rainfall and unpredictability of its spatial distribution, India's dependence on minor irrigation (MI) facilities has increased in the past few years, pushing private entities including farmers and communities, mostly to create an additional 1.42 million such facilities in the four years between 2013-14 and 2017-18 in an attempt to drought-proof agriculture. The sixth minor irrigation (MI) census report, released on Saturday, shows that the country had 23.14 million MI facilities in 2017-18 compared to 21.72 MI facilities in 2013-14 with groundwater irrigation infrastructure consistently logging over 94% of such in-

frastructure. Though high share of groundwater for farming operations leads to fast depletion of groundwater, it at least guards the farmers from uncertainties of monsoon rainfall.

(summer sown crops) acreage is an example. Farmers were able to increase the sown area of even water-guzzling paddy despite monsoon rainfall deficit of 8% as on Sunday.

Uttar Pradesh possesses the largest number of MI facilities in the country followed by Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Telangana. Leading states in groundwater schemes are Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Telangana whereas Maharashtra, Karnataka, Telangana, Odisha and Jharkhand have the highest share of surface water irrigation facilities.

The groundwater schemes comprise of dug-wells, shallow tube wells, medium tube wells and deep tube wells. Both groundwater and surface water facilities have increased by 6.9% and 1.2%, respectively, in 2017-18 over 2013-14 in the country. In groundwater schemes, the share of private entities in the ownership is 98.3% whereas in surface water schemes, the respective share is about 64%.

Dug-wells have the highest share in MI schemes followed by shallow tube wells, medium tube wells and deep tube wells. Maharashtra is the leading state in dug wells, surface flow

'Pragyan's movements pose multiple challenges'

Bengaluru: Pointing out that the rover operations weren't fully autonomous, Chandrayaan-3 project director P Veeramuthuvel said Pragyan's movements were riddled with multiple challenges, each of which would need to be overcome one at a time with the involvement of the ground teams.

"Moving the rover from point A to B involves many steps. For every path planning, onboard navigation camera data must be downloaded to ground for generation of a digital elevation model (DEM). Then the ground and mechanisms team will decide which path to take and uplink the command for the rover to follow," he said.

As for the rover's limitations, the maximum DEM that can be generated is for five metreseach time the navigation camera sends images. "This means every time the rover is commanded to move, it can at best cover five metres. Even there, there are challenges of obstacles, etc. We were very anxious about the first crater, but that obstacle has been overcome. Veeramuthuvel said.

Isro has already done multiple rover movements. "If you see, it is not like a big rover. Within the limited resources, we have put in place miniature systems that are state-of-the-art But there are limitations such as non-availability of telemet ry and telecommunications 24/7, the need to track the Sun continuously and so, the turnaround time between each movement operation is around five hours," he said.

"The Sun is not static there Each day, there's a 12° rotation, which needs to be accounted for as unlike the lander which has solar panels covered on three sides, the rover has deployable solar panel, where one side is fully mounted with solar cells but on the other side, only half the space is available," Veeramuthuvel said.

The data rate from the rover is also limited given that it can only communicate with the lander, from where the Isro ne-: eds to download to ground.

Retd armyman puts out a hit on son to 'spite' estranged wife

Meerut: A retired armyman, in his mid-50s, allegedly got his 27-year-old son killed by a contract killer to take revenge on his estranged wife. The incident occurred at Chhur village in the Sardhana area of Meerut, said police.

According to offici-

als, the accused, Sanjeev

Kumar, allegedly conspired with a local man, identified as Amit (30), and paid him Rs 5 lakh to get rid of his son, Sachin Kumar. SHO of Sardhana police station, Ramakant Pachori, told **TOI**, "While Sachin had been missing since Tuesday night, a formal complaint was filed by his mother on Saturday. In her complaint, she suspected her husband's involvement in their son's disappearance. Acting on the information, cops detained both Sanjeev and Amit for questioning."

The duo subsequently admitted to their crime. Sanjeev claimed that he wanted to take revenge on his estranged wife. Both the accused are now in custody.

A local resident, privy to the case, said, "Sanjeev had an affair with his sister-in-law and lived with her, leading his wife, Munesh, to leave him 15 years ago. Since then, she has resided separately with her son. Sachin, who was unmarried and the sole breadwinner in the family, was a delivery boy."

In order to kill Sachin, Amit on Tuesday first offered him alcohol. and after he was intoxicated, struck him on the head with a bottle, said the SHO. He added, "Once Sachin lost consciousness, Amit strangled him using a scarf. His motorcycle and phone were dropped at different locations and his body thrown in the Hindon river. Sanjeev also tried to mislead the police by attempting to file a missing person report for his son. The body was recovered from Baghpat, around 17 kilometres away from

the dumping spot."

TN train coach fire: Railway official rules out conspiracy

Madurai: Commissioner of Railway Safety for Southern Circle, A M Chowdhary, has ruled out conspiracy in Saturday's fire on the private coach stabled at the Madurai railway yard which killed nine passengers. Meanwhile, Government Railway Police (GRP) are questioning five attenders of the agency, who were believed to have used LPG cylinders for cooking in violation of the Railways Act, that booked the coach.

New Delhi: The banned pro-Khalistan secessionist outfit Sikhs For Justice (SFJ) defaced walls of several Metro stations with graffiti, causing a major security breach days before the G20 Summit in Delhi, reports Rajshekhar Jha. The SFJ, which accepted responsibility for the act, released footage of the Shivaji Park and Punjabi Bagh Metro stations on YouTube that showed slogans such as "Khalistan Zinda bad" and "Punjab Is Not India" on the walls.

Delhi Metro police have filed an FIR against the vandalism under IPC Sections on provocation for rioting (153) and public mischief (505). The investigation is likely to be transferred to the special cell, officials added. Police have also obtained CCTV : camera footage of the stations.

Minor kidnappers kill WB boy after 'fulfilling last wish' for rosogolla

Krishnanagar (Nadia): Sweet revenge took a bitter and bizarre turn in a Bengal village when three minors fed a 14-yearold "rosogolla and cold drinks to fulfil his dying wish" after a "Rs 3-lakh ransom call" to his widowed poor mother apparently went unheeded, reports Ashis **Poddar.** The revelations came forth in a police submission to a Juvenile Justice Board on Sunday in Nadia's Krishnanagar about the Class VIII student's August 25 death at the hands of his three kidnappers who wanted the ransom to "buy a computer to play games".

he golden arm of Neeraj Chopra follows the script to the tee. It is kind of predictable. 

Kipyegon claims historic 1500m-5000m double

Budapest: Kenya's Faith Kipyegon became the first woman ever to complete a 1,500-5,000 metres double at the World Championships after she raced to victory over the longer distance on Saturday.

Four days after she won the 1,500 metres, the two-time Olympic gold medallist surged away from Dutch Sifan Hassan down the home straight to cross in 14 minutes 53.88 seconds for another glorious finish.

Kipyegon's two golds from Budapest cap a remarkable season in which she broke three world records - in the 1,500m, mile and 5,000m. "This has been an amazing year for me. Making history today, winning two gold medals in a championships is what I was dreaming for this season," the

A CROSS-GENERATIONAL BATTLE

Focus On Djokovic, Champion Alcaraz As US Open Gets Under Way Today

ll Novak Djokovic needs to kick-off A record-extending 390th week atop
the ATP rankings is a first-round win in this sun-sparked New York borough of Queens. The 36-year-old hasn't lost in the opening round of a Grand Slam tournament since 2006.

A mere 20 points separates world No. 1 Carlos Alcaraz from the No. 2 Djokovic in the rankings heading into the US Open, starting Monday. Even in an age of few certainties, Djokovic himself being one of those indelible, time-tested designs, Alexandre Muller, ranked 85, from the commune of Poissy located in north-central France, isn't expected to rock the boat in the first round.

That's a matter of rankings, the story itself has been a rage of the sporting world. A man, a boy, a cross-generational clash.

Alcaraz, ripped frame and raging talent, inspired a tectonic shift in the sport with his triumph at Wimbledon in July.

Just when the bells chimed to the winds of change, the promise of youth, Djokovic came up with a masterclass in the great American Midwest. The Serb showed remarkable volition, battling back from a set and 2-4 down, warding off a match point in the second set tie-break, taking Alcaraz down in just under four hours.

"The more you find yourself in those circumstances, experiencing adversity on the court, that's the best opportunity for you to grow mentally, to learn something," said Djokovic, who could play Stefanos Tsitsipas in the last eight. "In the face of adversity is where you learn the most. That's my mentality in these matches, trying not to accept defeat as an option and giving it my all."

There's a lot happening. You're trying to outsmart your opponent tactically, but then you have to fight with your own demons as well, the self-doubt, tension, all the things that are happening in the midst of such a battle.'

The Serb, a 35-time major finalist, who has lost in the title round 12 times, six of them in New York, is returning to the United States for the first time in two years.



F1 record of nine straight victories. The Red Bull star clinched his third straight victory from pole position at the Zandvoort track, with veteran Aston Martin driver Fernando Alonso finishing second and picking up a bonus point for the fastest lap.

Alpine driver Pierre Gasly crossed the line in fourth place behind Red Bull driver Sergio Perez, but the Frenchman moved up to third because Perez was given a five-second at Circuit Zandvoort on Sunday penalty for speeding in the pit lane.


