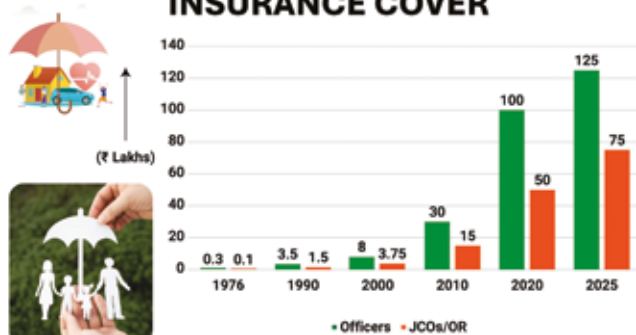


AGI BHAWAN

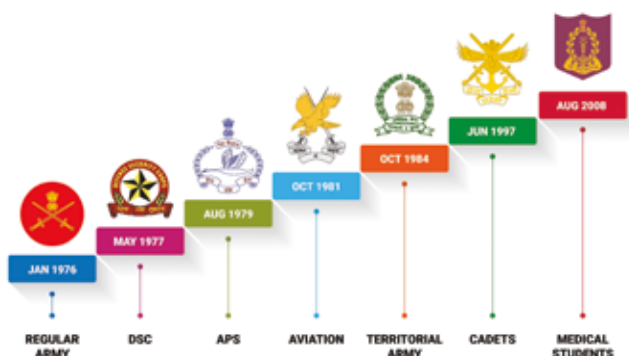
- Established on 01 Jan 1976, as a self-run and self-sustaining scheme under the aegis of the Adjutant General's Branch.

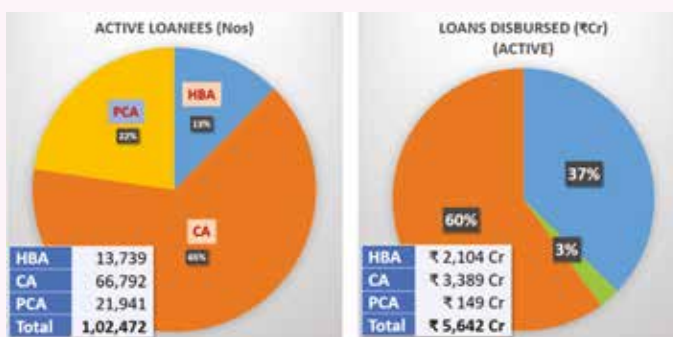
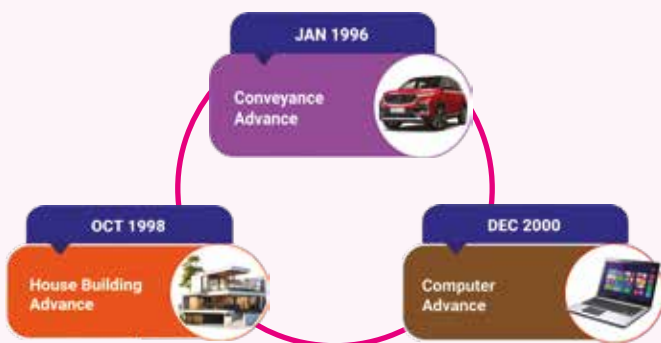
JOURNEY OF INCREASING INSURANCE COVER



GROWTH OF INSURANCE UMBRELLA

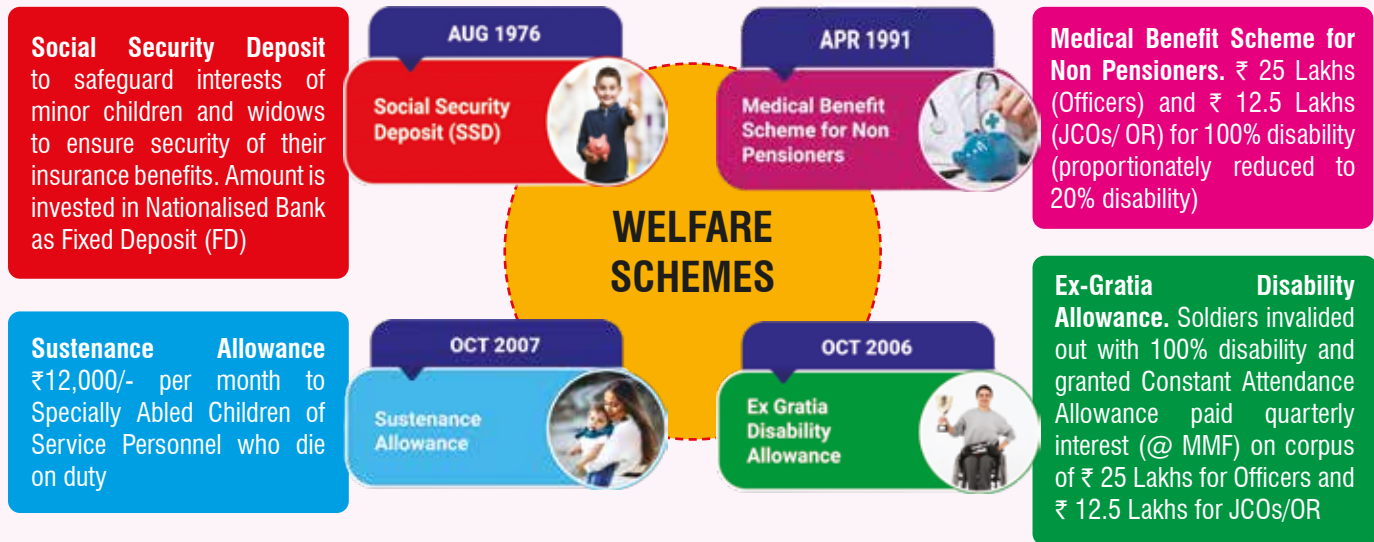

ONLINE PROCESSING OF LOANS/ ADVANCES: ADN (ARMY DATA NETWORK)

- With effect from 01 Jun 2025, all applications for House Building Advance (HBA), Conveyance Advance (CA) and Personal Computer Advance (PCA) are being accepted online through the Army Group Insurance Fund (AGIF) webpage on Army Data Network (ADN).
- Applications can be filled by visiting Indian Army Portal Home Page > Branches > AG's Branch > AGIF > Apply for Loan Online or using URL <https://agif.army.mil>. Loan application with complete documents are processed in five working days.

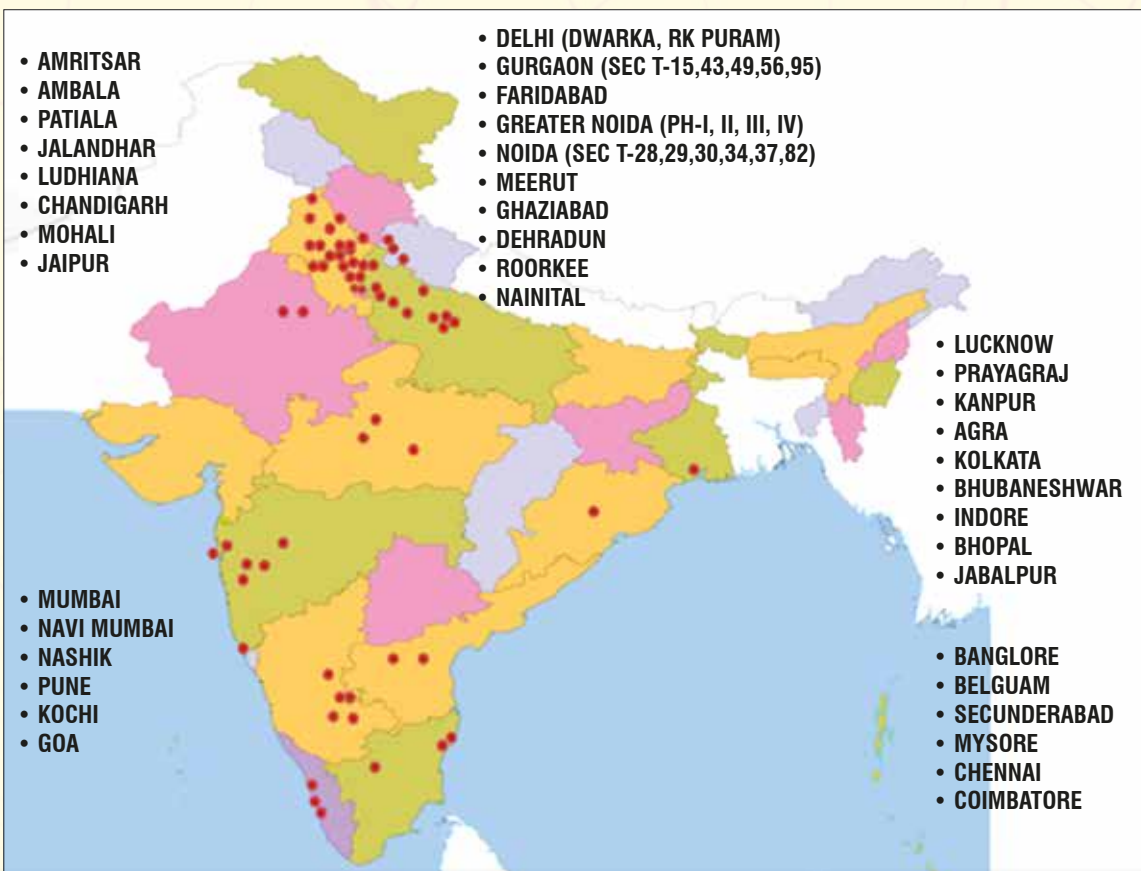
AWHO is a non-profit welfare housing organisation established in December 1978, under the Indian Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860

EQUIPMENT OF THE MONTH



INVAR MISSILE

INVAR missile is an Anti-Tank Guided Missile (ATGM), **intended to destroy modern and future armoured vehicles** including those fitted with Explosive Reactive Armour, small-size targets (pillbox and bunkers), field fortifications and slow flying aerial targets (e.g. helicopter). Its **semi-automatic laser guidance** enables precise targeting of both stationary and moving targets. Equipped with **Hollow & shaped charge Tandem warhead**, the INVAR missile enables precision engagement at extended ranges, significantly beyond conventional tank ammunition.

SPECIFICATIONS

- **Target Capability:** Engages both stationary and moving targets (up to 70 km/h).
- **Accuracy:** Hit probability exceeding 90%, even at extended ranges.
- **Control.** Canard control both electric and pneumatic.

KEY FEATURES

- **Effective Range:** 100 m to 5000 m
- **Launch Platform:** 125mm Smooth Bore Tank T-90
- **Guidance System:** Semi-Automatic Command to Line of Sight (SACLOS) Laser Beam Riding.
- **Warhead:** Tandem High-Explosive Anti-Tank (HEAT)

Significance in Indian Army

The **INVAR missile** represents a key element of modern tank firepower by combining the reach of a missile with the protection and mobility of a Main Battle Tank. Licensed production by Bharat Dynamics Limited strengthens **India's self-reliance in Defense manufacturing**, ensuring a steady supply for operational readiness. The missile **serves as a critical force multiplier, providing long-range precision firepower** and reinforces the T 90's role as a dominant platform in modern mechanized warfare.

BATTLE OF BASANTAR: INDO-PAK WAR 1971

During the 1971 Indo-Pak war, 47 Infantry Brigade with 17 POONA HORSE under command was ordered to establish a bridgehead across the Basantar River in Shankargarh Sector. As the bridgehead was established by 2100 hours on 15 December and the minefield breaching was under progress, a counter attack by the enemy was anticipated. At this critical juncture, 17 POONA HORSE decided to push through mine fields. At first light, the regiment established link up with the infantry. At about 0800 hours the enemy armour counter attacked own bridgehead. During the battle, 2nd Lt Arun Khetarpal led his tank troop and fiercely attacked enemy armour, strong points and recoilless guns. In the ensuing firefight, he destroyed one of the enemy tanks. As a result enemy was forced to retreat. However enemy regrouped and again counter attacked with ten tanks. In the ferocious fight, 2nd Lt Arun Khetarpal destroyed four enemy tanks by accurate fire. In the thick of battle, two of his tanks became casualties. One was hit and another suffered mechanical failure. Khetarpal's tank was also hit and burst into flames. He was ordered to abandon the tank but realising that the enemy was still pressing the attack in this sector and that if he abandoned his tank, the enemy would breakthrough, he continued engaging the enemy despite the grievous wounds and his own tank burning.

The last enemy tank which he shot, was barely 100 meters from his position. At this stage his tank received a second hit which proved to be fatal killing the brave tank

man. For his conspicuous gallantry in the face of the enemy, 2nd Lt Arun Khetarpal was honoured with the highest war time gallantry award, the Param Vir Chakra, posthumously. He had, by his intrepid valour saved the day and the enemy was denied the breakthrough which they were so desperately seeking. Not one enemy tank was able to break through own bridgehead.



The Hon'ble Raksha Mantri felicitated the family members of 2nd Lt Arun Khetarpal, PVC (Posthumous) and the next of kin (NOK) of his tank crew during the special screening of the film '*Ikkis*' at New Delhi. This movie is based on the Battle of Basantar, Indo - Pak War 1971.
